

DONOR BILL OF RIGHTS

The Full Frame Initiative raises a significant portion of its funding from the public and from donor institutions. If you are a donor to the Full Frame Initiative, you have the following rights:

1. To be informed of the Full Frame Initiative's mission, of the way the organization intends to use donated resources, and of its capacity to use donations effectively for their intended purposes.
2. To be informed of the identity of those serving on the Full Frame Initiative's governing board, and to expect the board to exercise prudent judgment in its stewardship responsibilities.
3. To have access to the Full Frame Initiative's most recent audited financial statements.
4. To be assured your gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given.
5. To receive appropriate acknowledgement and recognition.
6. To be assured that information about your donations is handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by law.
7. To expect that all relationships with individuals representing organizations of interest to the donor will be professional in nature.
8. To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers, employees of the organization or hired solicitors.
9. To have the opportunity for your name to be promptly deleted from mailing lists and other distribution lists.
10. To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.
